ELIGIBILITY



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Beginning in May, and continuing through November, the Emerging Leaders Institute will be comprised of three (3) one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) day sessions to be held in the Baton Rouge area. In order for the program to provide maximum benefits, participants are highly encouraged to commit and attend ALL three (3) sessions. Participants are eligible to earn a total of 22.5 AIA HSW/PDHs/LUs with full participation . Certificates to be awarded.

PARTICIPATION


